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## **PART I. Dr. Shenglin Elijah Chang Selected Bio (2000-2020)**

Shenglin Elijah Chang received her Ph.D. at UC Berkeley in 2000. Shenglin received the 2004 CELA Award of Recognition for Excellence in Teaching, Research, and Service in Landscape Architecture (CELA – Council of Educators in Landscape Architecture) in the U.S. In addition, she completed her book *Global Silicon Valley Home: Lives and Landscapes Within Taiwanese American Trans-Pacific Culture* (Stanford University Press, 2006). She soon received tenure in 2006 and the Lily Teaching Fellow status from 2007 to 2008. Born in Taiwan, she has developed and implemented innovative approaches to environmental issues through civic arts, community design participation, and social-enterprise activism. Shenglin is a joint-appointment professor serving in the Graduate Institute of Building and planning, the International Degree Program of Climate Change and Sustainable Development, and the Master's Program of Biodiversity at National Taiwan University (NTU). In addition, Dr. Chang currently serves as the Associate Dean at the Innovation and Design School (D School), engaging in the Future NTU 2028 program, and the Socio-economic Division Director of the Biodiversity Research Center.

Shenglin has faith in education as the driving force to pursue prosperity and equality for generations incoming. Focusing on transcultural sustainability, she contributes to the research of talent migrations and community revitalization in small islands and the countryside. Shenglin particularly intersects with multi-centered cultures, ethnicities, social classes, and national borders. She encountered children and young people in places like low-income African American communities of the U.S., indigenous tribes in the cloud forests of Costa Rica, Storks' fishers villages of Japan Sea, historical tea-hours trials of China, and historical shrinking small towns of Taiwan.

Being an educator since 1995, she teaches in various classrooms and communities worldwide while she interacts with multicultural values of learning, from the U.S., Costa Rica, Japan, and China to Taiwan.

Shenglin first encountered island research in the summer of 2009, when she took the invitation to be a visiting professor on Awaji Island in Japan. She turns the visit into a long-term rural Japan teaching program with Awaji Landscape Planning and Horticulture Academy (ALPHA), an extension campus of the Hyogo Prefecture University. Through the ALPHA partnerships, Shenglin conducted island-based satoyama revitalization field teaching in Awaji. At the same time, she studied in dozens of small cities, shrinking towns, and remote villages in the Kansai region, Kyoto Prefecture, Seta Sea, Nagoya area, and islands of Okinawa. Paralleling Japan, Shenglin researched and taught in rural China, such as Shanxi, Sichuan, Shandong, and Zhejiang. She collaborated with Sichuan University and co-teach rural social design in the International Studio from 2015 to 2019. The course won the 2017 Excellent International Curriculum Award at the Sichuan provincial level. Unfortunately, the corona pandemic temporarily terminated the China rural educational program.

Shenglin relocated from the U.S. to Taiwan in 2009. Since then, she has experimented with various action research via establishing the Innovation and Design School at NTU, the so-called NTU-D School. In December 2014, Shenglin with her colleagues received design thinking certificated training from the D School at Stanford University. Inspired by a user-oriented social design approach, from 2015 to 2019, she took the responsibility to serve as one of the principal directors for the Agricultural Humanity (AH) Program, the university-level curricula transformation of NTU. In the AH Program, thousands of NTU students and professors try their community-oriented teaching and learning outside campus for the first time. Interdisciplinary professors at NTU co-teach to provide high-quality teaching to rural villages and disadvantaged communities. She incubated two tea brands from her studio classes. Both turn into award-winning teams that have sustained their business for more than five years. Shenglin received the 4th National ROCTIRA Award for Social Service (第四屆國家智榮獎) in 2017 and the NTU University Services in Excellence Award (校內服務傑出獎) in 2020. From 2018 to 2021, Dr. Chang led the interdisciplinary research project, The Era of New Collaborations: Timebanking for Community Practices, founded by the Taiwan Ministry of Science and Technology. The project challenges the individualistic concepts of time by investigating time-based currency to experiment with Taiwanese communities' capacities for technology-based timebanking. Our transdisciplinary team integrates community building professionals and AI-Blockchain experts. Together, we work with both urban and rural high school students and social housing residents. We aim to publish platforms and apps fitting the Taiwanese local cultures through hands-on prototype testing.
